Creative Writing Practice Test 2

Objective:

Exercise:

- Use the chosen topic to draft a short expository piece incorporating the identified characteristics and language.

Share and Discuss:

- Participants share their expository pieces with the group.
- Discuss the diversity of topics and how different structures enhance the clarity of explanations.

Tips:

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- Encourage participants to choose topics that resonate with them personally.
- Emphasize the importance of maintaining an informative and unbiased tone.
- Provide feedback on language use, clarity, and adherence to the chosen structure.

Sample Expository Topic:

Explain why maintaining a healthy lifestyle is crucial in today's fast-paced world.
