Reading Test

Task Types:

The Reading module includes a variety of task types, such as:

Multiple Choice Questions: You must choose the correct answer from a list of options.

True/False/Not Given or Yes/No/Not Given: You need to determine if statements provided in the questions are true according to the text, false, or not mentioned in the text.

Matching Information: You have to match information in the text with a set of given options.

Matching Headings: Test takers must match a list of headings or titles to specific paragraphs or sections of the text.

Summary, Note, Table, Flowchart Completion: You are required to complete a summary, note, table, flowchart, or diagram based on the information in the text.

Sentence Completion: You need to complete sentences with words or phrases from the text. afel.co.ir

Timing:

The Academic version consists of three passages, and test takers have 60 **minutes** to complete the section.

The General Training version has three sections, and the total time for this section is also 60 minutes.
